
This is a celebration of our diverse cycling community with workshops, refreshments, and good vibes. Cycling is for everybody. Free event.

Meeting with NYSDOT



Members of the Board and Media Team recently met with the I-81 Viaduct Project Team, including members of the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) and City of Syracuse to discuss our Project Recommendations (previously called our Public Comment). They were particularly amenable to the following recommendations:

- **Protected bike lanes in an interconnected network** throughout the project, separated with bollards or flexible delineators where a raised curb separation is not possible.
- Longer bridge spans over local roads to ensure the possibility of constructing wide sidewalks below in the future.
- Incorporating **locally designed public art and** artistically designed **utilitarian objects** such as unique trash cans, bike racks, benches, etc. by allocating project money to the city for this purpose.
- Safer traffic signals such as **eliminating right on red and** incorporating **leading pedestrian and cyclist interval crossing signals**.
- **Native plantings and meadows** instead of lawns and hardscaped surfaces, also considering a vibrant winter appearance.

- A crosswalk at West Street & Park Avenue to give access to NYSDOT's Creekwalk extension to the directly adjacent Park Avenue Neighborhood.
- Creating a **safer and more inviting pedestrian entrance** underneath I-690 **to the Hawley-Green neighborhood** at the north end of the reconstructed Almond Street with art, wide sidewalks, and fun lights, while ensuring the protected bike lanes on Almond Street don't transition to unprotected bike lanes underneath the highway bridge.
- Creating safer and more frequent **pedestrian and cyclist crossings of Almond Street at Madison, Monroe, and Cedar**.
- Adjusting the curvature of Genesee Street to **eliminate the** triangular pedestrian island and **slip lane at** the southeast corner of **Almond and Genesee**.

We ask that they continue to consider the following recommendations:

- The Almond Street Median as a linear park. If the median is to be 20 ft wide, we've attached a photo of Broadway Malls in Manhattan for reference, which is also 20 ft wide.
- Mature trees at key project locations to create a welcoming pedestrian space from day one.
- Business remediation funds for those affected by the construction process.
- Right of way reductions.
- **Reconnecting East Washington Street** between Forman Ave and University Ave as a pedestrian/cyclist path.
- The many other recommendations from our document, which is attached along with our agenda from yesterday's meeting.
- Ensuring that no upcoming contracts will be design build.

Project Updates

Mini Meadows



The Mini Meadows project is seeking to do citywide grass-to-native meadow/wildflower conversions with an emphasis on community involvement and sustainable long-term maintenance.

Right now we are targeting a \$2,000 grant offered by the Syracuse Parks Conservancy. We are seeking any and all input regarding meadow location, design, seed mixes, and so forth. Anyone looking to provide input may do so by clicking on the following link: <u>Mini Meadows Survey</u>.
