ADVOCACY AND ACTIVISM: 101

What change would you like to see in your community? Do you want to help, but you do not know where to begin? Are you new to community advocacy and activism? Are you a seasoned organizer who wants to learn new techniques?

Our first workshop will allow you to gain knowledge of several types of advocacy and activism. Most people have a limited view of what advocacy and activism is. Seed Saving and Homemade Farm Fresh Dinner with Salt City Harvest Farm



Salt City Harvest Farm has an amazing opportunity for those who want to learn how to save seeds from the food they consume and/or flowers they love. They are having a FREE seed cleaning session. From their site: "Bring your own seeds to clean, winnow, and process. Crystal Stewart-Courtens will be bringing a mobile seed cleaning trailer full of tools and equipment to process anywhere between a handful - bags full of seeds." Once again, this is FREE! The Bus Benches Art Project is a community art project that aims to highlight the multicultural and diverse Syracuse Northside neighborhood through public art. Using wooden benches as blank canvas and inviting the Northside Youth to express their creativity, the goal of this project is to install the benches at bus stops throughout North Salina street.

Originally each bench was meant to represent single cultures found in the neighborhood, however, the project went beyond these original intentions to something greater. The resulting benches now reflect what happens when youth from various cultural backgrounds get together to create

something. Each design now displays the aspirations, dreams, and aesthetic ideas shared among young people who have recently found themselves relocated from their respective mono-cultures to a shared place with a vibrant diversity and multiculturalism.

The coordinating, facilitating and mentoring artists involved in this project were Daniela Nikolavsky (original concept development, mentor), David "Clarke" Smith (lead coordinator, supervisor, mentor), Romina Mendoza (supervisor, mentor), Brandon Lazore (workshop facilitator, mentor), and Fasika Zewdie (supervisor, mentor).

This project was made possible by collaboration with Hopeprint, a Syracuse-based 501c3 organization that facilitates sustainable development in marginalized communities and through funding by the United Way of Central New York.

I-81 Viaduct Project Recommendations

We're continuing to meet with NYSDOT to discuss their progress on the I-81 Viaduct Project contracts. Currently they're designing Contract 6, which mostly concerns I-690 from Leavenworth to Crouse, a bit of West Street and I-81, and northern Downtown. We're also meeting with EGRA (the business district for East Genesee Street east of I-81), to discuss some of our proposed design changes for the project in their neighborhood.

Regional Planning Policy Platform

We're working to finalize our comic strip showing a child's walk to their friend's house through well-planned and poorly planned communities, highlighting the importance of planning with urbanism in mind.

Urbanist Book Club

Our next book is Building and Dwelling by Richard Sennett. We plan to have an order of books arriving soon! Then, we'll continue with book club meetings!

Moving People Transportation Coalition
